Out of School Workforce Survey 2014 Results

Scottish Out of School Care Network (SOSCN) January 2015



INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

The Scottish Out of School Care Network (SOSCN) is the national intermediary organisation for out of school care in Scotland. It is a Scottish registered charity (SC020520) and was established in 1991.

The survey was made available online via www.freeonlinesurveys.com. If requested, services were also sent paper copies of the questionnaire; any data received via paper copies was also inputed into the online survey, which was also used to analyse the results. As an incentive to complete and return the form, all completed surveys received before the closing date were entered into a prize draw.

In total, **200** completed surveys were received, although **39** were incomplete for Job Category with the SSSC, which rendered them unusable. This number of returns was higher than the previous year, however the number of incomplete and therefore discounted returns was also higher; for future surveys we shall look at ways of reducing the number of incomplete returns.

Of this number, **75** were from Lead Practitioners (a c. 25% higher return than last year), **52** from Practitioners (c.25% lower return than last year), **34** from Support Workers (slightly higher return, but nearly the same as last year). Of the analysed returns, **138** females and **20** males responded (3 unknown).

3 had a registered disability (5 were unknown).

In terms of ethnicity **152** were White: Scottish/English/Welsh/Northern Irish; **1** was White: Irish; **1** was Asian/Asian UK: Indian; **1** was Asian/Asian UK: Chinese; **1** was other ethnic group: other, and **5** were unknown.

Note: This is the seventh year of this survey being undertaken, and although many of the questions remained the same as previous years additional questions were asked in terms of content of qualifications and how confident staff were putting this into practice.

Due to the level of returns this is at best a 'barometer' of the pay, condition, qualification levels etc of the out of school care workforce in Scotland.
